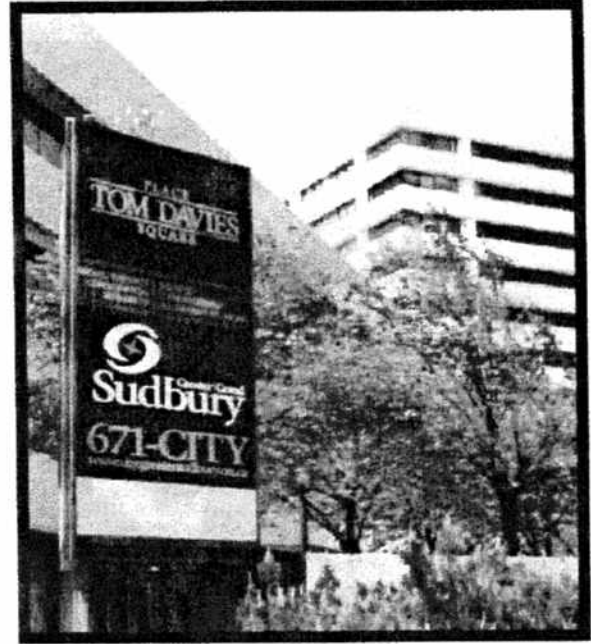

Summary

The purpose of this report is to outline the appointment process to the following Citizen Advisory Panels:

1. Accessibility Advisory Panel
2. Adanac Advisory Panel
3. Agricultural and Topsoil Advisory Panel
4. Arts and Culture Grant Advisory Panel
5. Bicycle Advisory Panel
6. Children First Roundtable (Advisory Panel)
7. Development Liaison Advisory Panel
8. Diversity Advisory Panel
9. Earthcare Sudbury Advisory Panel
10. Greater Sudbury Lake Improvement Advisory Panel & Lake Ramsey Advisory Panel
11. Healthy Community Cabinet Advisory Panel
12. Seniors' Advisory Panel
13. Solid Waste Advisory Panel
14. Street Naming Committee
15. VETAC Advisory Panel

Due to the limited number of applications received for the Lake Ramsey Advisory Panel and the fact that this panel is slated to become the Ramsey Lake Trust, it is therefore recommended that in the interim this group be integrated with the Greater Sudbury Lake Improvement Advisory Panel as they have similar goals and objectives.

All appointments will end November 30, 2008 or until their successors are appointed, whichever occurs later.

All appointments will be confirmed by Council on the adoption of the minutes of the Nomination Committee.

A report listing the names of the applicants, their address and ward has been forwarded to Members of Council under separate cover.

Background

Council at their meeting of January 31, 2007 reviewed the status of twenty-six (26) Committees, Advisory Panels and Round Tables and agreed that fifteen (15) Advisory Panels and one (1) Committee be established. Resolutions #2007-48 and #2007-49 read as follows:

Resolution #2007-48

"That the recommendations in the report from the Executive Director, Administrative Services be adopted;

And that staff be directed to advertise and/or recruit members for Advisory Panels as described in the Terms of Reference and bring nominations to the Nominations Committee of Council for appointment and approval; with the exception of the Volunteerism and Civic Awards Advisory Panel, which will be referred to Volunteer Sudbury;

And that the term of the Advisory Panels be two years."

Resolution #2007-49

That the Street Naming Committee be removed from the list of Advisory Panels and brought back as a Committee.

Recruitment of Citizens for Advisory Panels

Recruitment for appointments was done through local newspapers, the City's website and by contacting a number of special interest groups. The deadline for submission of applications was March 19, 2007, however, the deadline was extended to March 30, 2007 in order that further applications could be received. A copy of the advertisements is attached for the information of the Committee.

Membership

The membership on each panel varies from being totally comprised of only citizens, to a combination of citizens and community "experts" and to stakeholder interests only, as described on the attached charts. Members of Council are not required to sit on Advisory Panels although they may choose to be members, or to attend informally at meetings of those Panels which are of interest. A number of Councillors have advised the City Clerk's Office of Advisory Panels for which they are interested in being members:

Term

In accordance with resolution #2007-48, the term of the Advisory Panels and Committees is to November 30, 2008 or until their successors are appointed whichever occurs later.

Appointments to Advisory Panels

The appointments to Advisory Panels have been separated into two groups. The Terms of Reference for the first group of panels (Schedule "A") include specific requirements for appointment, such as the Development Liaison Advisory Panel which includes representatives from the Sudbury & District Homebuilders Association, the Sudbury Construction Association, etc. Recommendations with respect to membership for the group of Advisory Panels outlined in Schedule "A" have been provided by staff.

The second group of Advisory Panels (Schedule "B") is advertised to the general public and in some cases also include representative appointments, such as the Bicycle Advisory Committee which has five (6) citizens and one (1) representative from Rainbow Routes.

Selection

The voting process to be used will be decided by the Nomination Committee at the outset of the meeting.

Where the number of applicants is less than or equal to the number of vacant positions, then a motion to appoint the applicants will be introduced for the Committee's consideration.

In order to be appointed, the applicant must receive a majority of votes (for example if all thirteen Members of Council are present, applicants would require seven (7) votes to be appointed). In the event of an equality of votes, then the successful candidate is to be determined by lot conducted by the Clerk.

Under *Robert's Rules of Order* a nomination does not need a second.

Once the successful candidates have been selected, then a resolution will be introduced confirming the appointment of the successful candidates.

Attached is Article 37 of the Procedure By-law which deals with Citizen Appointments.

RULES OF PROCEDURE BY-LAW 2006-100

ARTICLE 37

NOMINATION COMMITTEE - CITIZEN APPOINTMENTS

37.1 Made by Committee of the Whole - Procedure

Appointments to the various local boards, Advisory Panels and corporations of the City shall be recommended by the Nomination Committee at a meeting called for that purpose. In making such appointments, the procedure set out in this article shall apply unless otherwise provided in a shareholders' declaration.

37.2 Advertising - position - requirements - to local citizens

At least thirty (30) days prior to the Committee meeting at which a Citizen appointment is scheduled to be considered, the Clerk shall place an advertisement in a local newspaper to run on at least two occasions and place an advertisement on radio or television or both, as the Clerk deems advisable, on at least one (1) occasion outlining the position to be filled and inviting applications from interested citizens. A copy of each advertisement shall be provided to each Member of the Committee.

37.3 Applications - in writing - time limitation

All Citizen applications for appointment must be in writing and received by the Clerk at least four (4) clear days prior to the meeting of the Committee.

37.4 Applications - qualifying - included - Committee of the Whole Agenda

Copies of all applications received for each position from qualifying applicants shall be included with the agenda material for the Committee of the Whole meeting concerned.

37.5 Applicants - qualified - exact number - motion

Where there are only the exact number of qualified applicants as required for any position or positions, a motion to appoint the applicants to the position or positions concerned shall be presented and voted upon.

37.6 Applicants - qualified - more than required - selection

If there are more qualified applicants than positions available, then the Committee shall recommend from the qualified applicants the ones to fill the position or positions concerned.

37.7 Roll call vote - Committee - taken - regarding applicants

A roll call vote of the Committee shall be taken with respect to the qualified applicants for each position available.

37.8 Appointment - determined - by vote - exception

If upon the first roll call vote no applicant receives the votes of the majority of Members present, the name of the applicant receiving the least number of votes shall be dropped and the Members shall proceed to vote anew and so continue until either an applicant receives the votes of the majority of Members present, at which time such applicant shall be declared to be the recommended candidate; or, it becomes apparent by reason of an equality of votes that no applicant can be recommended by the voting process.

37.9 Voting - unsuccessful - position selected - by lot

Where by reason of an equality of votes, it becomes apparent that no applicant can be selected by the voting process, then the recommended applicant shall be the applicant selected by lot by the Clerk.

37.10 Special vote - applicants tied - least number of votes

In the case where no applicant receives the majority required for appointment on a roll call vote, and where two or more applicants are tied with the least number of votes, a special roll call vote shall be taken to decide which of the tied applicants with the least number of votes shall be dropped from the list of names to be voted on in the next roll call vote.

37.11 Staff Member - appointment - conditions

Except where prohibited by law, the Committee may recommend the appointment of a Member of staff to a local board or outside agency in the place of a Member of Council when no Member of Council wishes to be appointed.

37.12 Further votes

If no person receives more than half the votes, the Clerk shall take another vote, excluding the person who received the fewest votes in the previous vote; if two or more persons received the fewest votes, the Clerk shall choose the person to be excluded by lot.

37.13 Term of Appointment - Citizens

Citizens appointed by the Committee to Advisory Panels, local boards and committees shall be appointed for the term of office coinciding with the term of Council, or the terms set out in such appointments, and until their successors are appointed unless otherwise provided by Council, the Committee or by law.

37.14 Council Appointments - ballots

At the first regular meeting of a new Council, or as soon thereafter as is reasonable, Council shall appoint Members to Committees by way of simultaneous, written, signed ballots which will be read aloud by the Clerk and recorded in the minutes.

37.15 Council Appointments - destruction of ballots

These ballots, as well as ballots used for simultaneous roll-call votes generally, may be destroyed by the Clerk and need not be retained following the confirmation of the minutes.

The City of Greater Sudbury has extended the deadline for applications for appointment to Citizen Advisory Panels. Citizen Advisory Panels submit recommendations to the Council of Greater Sudbury to help shape programs and services in our community.

Be an Active Part of Your Community

Who is Eligible?

Canadian citizens age 18 and over who are owners/tenants, or spouses of owners/tenants, of land within the boundaries of the City of Greater Sudbury.

Each of the following panels will serve for a two year term, ending November 30, 2008:

Accessibility Advisory Panel
