Goal

Help shape children's attitudes about the importance of water in their lives - its use, consumption and protection.



Background

- Third year for the Festival;
- Scheduled 26th/27th of September, to be held at the Anderson Farm Museum;
- Open to Grade 3 students from all area School Boards; and
- Local high schools and colleges invited to volunteer.



Background

- Co-sponsored by:
 - Sudbury & District Health Unit
 - City of Greater Sudbury
 - Nickel District Conservation Authority
- 800 students participated in 2006 Festival.



Background

- Educate children about the importance of water;
- Offers hands-on learning with a field day atmosphere;
- Features roughly 30 learning stations; and
- 800+ students expected this year.

Lift away roads to see water delivery, wastewater flow, and stormwater pipes!

Lift buildings to see water treatment and wastewater treatment processes!



Includes full color groundwater graphic and working rural well!
