Declarations of Pecuniary Interest Councillor Gasparini declared a conflict regarding Item R-1 (Physician Incentive Program - Future Budget Commitments), as her daughter is graduating from medical school this year.

Councillor Dupuis declared a conflict regarding Item C-1 (By-law 2008-41F - Cancellation, Reduction or Refund of Realty Taxes in the City Council Minutes of February 13, 2008), as he owns one of the properties.

## **COMMUNITY DELEGATIONS**

Item 4 Advisory Panel on Municipal Mining Revenues

Dr. Jose Blanco, Chair, Expert Advisory Panel on Municipal Mining Revenues, made an electronic presentation. He listed the members of the Advisory Panel on Municipal Mining Revenues. He stated that the Advisory Panel's primary recommendations is that Council invite the Province to enter into negotiations to establish a resource revenue-sharing framework that will ensure a predictable and sustainable revenue stream for the Municipality. He stated that until 1973 mining industry properties were exempt from municipal taxes and industries provided most of their own services. In 1973, surface mining and processing facilities became taxable and underground facilities remained exempt. He indicated that major mining companies' share of the City's tax base decreased due to shrinking facilities and the City's diversification. He outlined municipal funding from the province since 1937. He indicated there is a precedent for sharing resource revenue with local communities, i.e. Peace River Regional District and Voisey's Bay Impact and Benefits Agreement. He stated that mining is profitable again with most capital spent underground. More mining activities place a greater demand on municipal services and infrastructure which requires funds that the City does not have.

The following resolution was presented:

2008-64 Cimino-Caldarelli: THAT Council of the City of Greater Sudbury thank the members of the Advisory Panel on Municipal Mining Revenues for their final report, *A Refined Argument*, and that the panel be officially dissolved.

FURTHER, THAT Council accept the main recommendation of the report:

That the Council of the City of Greater Sudbury invite the Province of Ontario to enter into negotiations with the City to establish a resource revenue-sharing framework that will ensure a predictable and sustainable revenue stream for the Municipality.

And further that Council circulate this report and consult with other northern resource communities.

FURTHER, THAT an action group composed of the Mayor and two councillors, with staff support, be established to implement this recommendation and that they be empowered to recruit citizens and others to assist in the effort.

FURTHER, THAT the CAO be directed to establish a staff working group to analyze the panel's secondary recommendations and report to Council as soon as possible with options for implementing these recommendations and for developing the in-house expertise described in the panel report.

FURTHER, THAT copies of the report be forwarded to the Federation of Northern Ontario Municipalities, as well as the Association of Municipalities of Ontario for their consideration in the context of the Provincial Municipal Fiscal Review, and to the Minister of Northern Development and Mines and the Minister of Public Infrastructure Renewal, for inclusion in the development of the Northern Growth Plan.

Councillors Cimino and Dupuis were appointed to the Action Group.

Email dated 2008-02-11 was received from Maya Caron, Environmental Planner, Stantec Consulting Ltd. regarding Southwest By-pass Widening between Highway 69 and Municipal Road 55.

The report presented at the City Council meeting of January 16, 2008 regarding the South West By-pass Widening and the relevant portion of the minutes of the meeting were distributed to Council Members.

David McCann, Senior Consultant, Stantec Consulting Ltd., made an electronic presentation regarding the Planning, Preliminary Design and Environmental Assessment Study of Highway 17 Sudbury Southwest Bypass Four-laning. He outlined the study area plan, the purpose of the study and the Environment Assessment process. He listed the public consultations from the Notice of Study Commencement in June of 2006 to the 30-day public review period of the report in fall of 2008. He provided a background of the two alternatives (a full interchange at Southview Drive or a full interchange at Fielding Road), results of the traffic and business studies and the evaluation of the alternatives. He explained their preferred plan (full interchange at Southview Drive) and the reasons for their choice. He concluded by outlining the next steps leading to the report for public review period.

Item 5 Southwest By-pass Widening between Highway 69 and Municipal Road 55 Item 6 2008 Earth Day Festival Letter dated 2008-01-21 was received from The Greater Sudbury Environmental Network Earth Day Committee regarding 2008 Earth Day Festival.

A letter of invitation and poster were distributed to Council Members.

Scott Card, Coordinator, Greater Sudbury Environmental Network, made an electronic presentation regarding the 2008 Earth Day Festival. He advised that the Network is seeking to protect and enhance the environment by promoting geographic, economic and environmental awareness in the Greater Sudbury basin and adjacent He provided a background on Earth Day which is celebrated every April 22 by 500 million people in over 180 countries. He stated that nearly every school child in Canada takes part of an Earth Day activity. He indicated that Earth Day in Greater Sudbury is to create positive public awareness for environmental solutions, encourage citizens to take environmental action and maintain the positive celebration of Earth Day annually. He advised that over 5,000 people attended the 2007 Earth Day with 85 green organizations and businesses and 7 food vendors exhibited and outlined some of the activities. He listed the members of the Earth Day Festival Committee including Nickel District Conservation Authority and Eat Local Sudbury. He outlined the benefits to Greater Sudbury and the opportunities for growth. He thanked the City of Greater Sudbury for their support by providing items such as tables and chairs and free bus fare with a coupon. He concluded with an invitation to the 2008 Earth Day Festival.

## Rules of Procedure

Council, by a two-thirds majority, agreed to dispense with the Rules of Procedure, to alter the order of the Agenda and deal with Item R-4 (Earth Hour).

2008-65 Rodriguez-Dupuis: WHEREAS climate change is the biggest environmental threat to our planet and the number one concern for Canadians;

AND WHEREAS the City of Greater Sudbury has been recognized as a Regional Centre of Excellence on Education for Sustainable Development;

AND WHEREAS our community has a long tradition of local action on environmental issues, such as EarthCare Sudbury and the regreening initiative;

AND WHEREAS, as part of Earth Hour 2008, cities, businesses and individuals around the world will turn off their lights for one hour, from 8:00 to 9:00 pm on Saturday March 29 to show it's possible to take action on climate change and to send a message that they care about our planet and want to be part of the solution;

AND WHEREAS the City of Greater Sudbury is Northern Ontario's largest city and plays a leadership role in our region;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council declares the hour of 8:00 to 9:00 pm on Saturday March 29, 2008 to be Earth Hour in the City of Greater Sudbury;

FURTHER, Council calls upon its community partners to participate in this initiative and requests that Greater Sudbury Utilities encourage its customers to also participate;

FURTHER, Council directs municipal staff to work to extinguish as many lights in and around city buildings and facilities as is safe and reasonable during Earth Hour 2008;

FINALLY, Council directs staff to encourage all EarthCare partners to participate in this initiative and to coordinate a campaign to inform the public as to how they can participate.

Nellie Lanteigne, Chair, Racing Against Drugs Sudbury Coalition, made a verbal presentation regarding the Racing Against Drugs Program. She indicated that the RCMP were contacted and they agreed to partners with students of Grades 5 and 6. All school boards agreed to participate and due to the overwhelming response it was limited to Grade 5 students. She advised that Racing Against Drugs Sudbury will take place at the Centre Lionel E. Lalonde Centre on April 8 to 10, 2008. She stated they have excellent partners such as Greater Sudbury Police Service, Emergency Medical Services, Sudbury and District Health Unit, Centre de Santé and Ministry of Transportation. She indicated that help from organizations has been tremendous. She advised that the theme or

message of the Program is asking kids to stop and not to be influenced by peer pressure. She concluded by inviting Council Members to the event.
